
Do you need a permit to plant a street tree?



Trees planted on parkways do require permits. These permits are free and easy to get. If you would like to get a permit for an Endless Orchard street fruit tree follow the instructions below.

PLANT A FRUIT TREE IN YOUR PARKWAY

- Request a Tree Planting Permit by calling the Bureau of Street Services Service Request Center at (800) 996-2489. Specify that you will be planting a fruit tree.
- Urban Forestry Division (UFD) will contact you and set an inspection date
- Inspection will determine
 - o The fruit tree species you can plant
 - o Tree planting location(s) which will be marked on curb
 - o Number of trees you can plant
 - *Please note sometimes, due to the existence of power poles, meters, driveways, etc., a permit will not be issued.
- UFD arborist will issue a tree planting permit with all pertinent information including tree planting specifications
- Please contact the inspector who issued the permit no more than five days after planting. The inspector will re-inspect and sign-off the final approval

The goal of UFD is to inspect tree planting permits within five working days of the request. If you need further information, please contact the Division at (213) 847-3077.
